 - a. Recruit and retain outstanding faculty in the range of applications and specialties of Process-oriented Psychology
2. Advance knowledge of Process-oriented Psychology through training, collaboration, and research
 - a. Build community alliances and partnerships through internships, the Summer Institute, and co-sponsoring events and conferences on topics of interest to local and international professionals and practitioners
 - b. Expand our library resources and research opportunities, offering a gateway to electronic resources and education, including professional databases in the field of psychology, health and wellness, conflict resolution, and organizational development
 - c. To develop partnerships with other agencies, schools, and institutions – to carry out research on issues related to our vision and mission
3. To promote community, diversity, and social and personal well-being through the community building tools of Process-oriented Psychology

Course Registration

Registration Procedure

To enroll, please complete the Class Registration Form available from the PWI website, the office or in the back of this catalog. You can mail or fax it back to us. You can also call or email the office to register.

Please note: You are not considered registered for a class until full payment is received.

- We accept checks in US Dollars, cash, wire transfer, Visa, or MasterCard for class registration. Make checks payable to the Process Work Institute. Please inquire at the office for wire transfer information.
- It is not possible to attend single sessions of any multi-session class, unless specified. Exceptions may be made for participants who live out of town. Please contact PWI to request an exception well in advance of the class starting date.
- Advanced registration is requested for all classes. It helps us in our administration and allocation of scholarships. Your cooperation is much appreciated.

Class Costs

Class prices are listed with each class. Members receive a 10% discount. There is also a 10% discount for registering by the early deadline. These discounts are cumulative, so a member who registers early gets a 20% discount.

- **Early registration** payment must be received by the early deadline to qualify for the discounted price.
- **Member price** includes all PWI members (regular, diplomate, alumni) and students currently enrolled in PWI's degree/certificate programs.
- **CE (Continuing Education) credit** certificates cost an additional \$30 and must be requested at time of registration.
- **Distance versions of classes cost the same as if you attend in person. A recorded package deal** is available for some distance classes. When you register for some classes you will be asked to specify whether you plan to attend *in person*, *distance* or *recorded*. If you register for *in person* or *distance*, for an additional payment of \$45 you can also receive the recorded file. Please inquire in the office at time of registration.

Work-Study Scholarships

Work-study scholarships for classes are administered by the Institute. Work-study is required in exchange for scholarships. Contact the PWI office to request a scholar-

ship. Scholarships are given primarily on a first come-first served basis.

Location and Time

Unless otherwise noted, classes are held at the Process Work Institute. All times listed are Pacific Time.

Confidentiality Policy

Notes taken during class, as well as handouts and class materials, are for personal use and may be distributed to fellow participants but may not be given to nonparticipants unless the instructor(s) gives explicit permission. Audio and video taping is only allowed with permission from the instructor. Audio and video tapes cannot be distributed to non-class participants without the permission of the instructor. No audio or video taping of personal work is allowed – this includes work of a personal or professional nature, i.e., case supervision, unless the person who is working explicitly requests that his/her work be taped for personal use. No names or personal details of participants' experiences may be shared with people outside the class.

In case consultation classes, participants must take measures to ensure the confidentiality of their clients: no names or identifying descriptions can be used, and in all cases, the client, an individual or a group, must remain anonymous. Participants may not discuss any case details outside the class.

Continuing Education Courses Refund Policy

Participants may cancel their registration in a course in any manner (in writing, in person or by phone), but to protect the participant's interests and to establish a record to resolve any misunderstandings, we strongly advise that any requests for cancellation be made or followed up with email or other written communication. Participants who elect to cancel their registration within five (5) calendar days of registration but prior to the first day of the course will receive a full refund of all money paid. Participants who elect to cancel their registration after five (5) calendar days of registration but prior to the first day of the course, will be refunded all money paid, less a registration fee of \$20.

When a participant elects to withdraw from a course after attending any portion of the first class in that course but less than 50% of all the classes in the course, the Process Work Institute may retain the registration fee of \$20 plus a percentage of the total course price, which shall not exceed the following:

- A. Up to and including 10% of the course completed, PWI retains 10% of the refundable course price.

- B. Between 10% and 25% of the course completed, PWI retains 25% of the refundable course price.
- C. Between 25% and 50% of the course completed, PWI retains 50% of the refundable course price.
- D. After the participant completes more than 50% of the course, PWI shall be entitled to retain the total course price.

In case of a participant illness, accident, psychological emergency, death in family or other circumstances beyond the control of the participant, the Process Work Institute will give special consideration to the participant's request for cancellation beyond the minimum refund policy.

Minimum Enrollment

If minimum enrollment of four (4) people is not met for a class, the teacher has the option to cancel the class. If the class is cancelled, students will be notified and a full refund will be issued.
